Nathan Law MA (Yale) is a protest leader, political prisoner and former legislator of Hong Kong. Since 2020 he has been wanted under the National Security Law by the Hong Kong authority and exiled in the UK. He was recognized by TIME magazine as one of the People of the Year in 2020 and was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize multiple times.

Dr. Julius Weitzdörfer MA (Cantab) is a Junior Professor of East Asian Law and a Co-Director of the Institute for International Legal Relations at Hagen University. Previously, he was a Junior Faculty Fellow at the Harvard Kennedy School of Government, an Affiliated Lecturer and a Director of Studies in Law at the University of Cambridge. He currently leads on the development of three degree programmes, covering Japanese law, Korean law, and Taiwanese law, each unique in the world.
